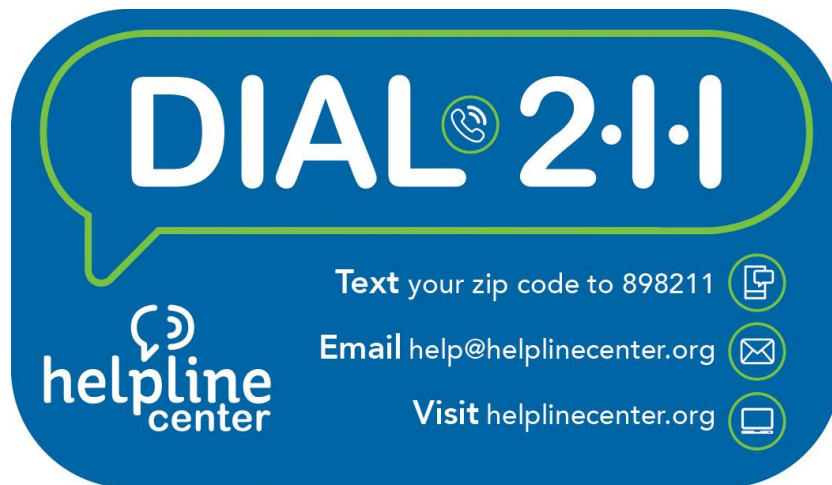
Schedules free transportation for veterans that have medical appointments with the Veterans Administration (VA).
