# Letter from the CEO

Dear friends,

It is a privilege to reflect upon the previous year and share our 2023 Annual Report. With sincere thanks to our compassionate staff and the generous support we receive, we are able to live out our mission of, "making lives better by giving support, offering hope and creating connections all day, every day."

We were honored to celebrate the 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary of 988 on July 16, 2023. When people call, text, or chat 988, they are connected to skilled crisis counselors at the Helpline Center who listen to concerns, provide support, connect to additional resources, and provide follow up care. Since the beginning, more than 14,000 people have called, texted, or chatted with us.

In 2023, we were blessed to be chosen as the benefactor again of The 437 Project. For the second year in a row, 12 runners ran relay style across South Dakota, all while raising awareness for mental health and suicide prevention. With the funds raised, we brought in a national speaker to share her story of her suicide attempt and held events in communities across the state viewing her documentary film. Funds also provided Helpline Center staff access to adequate training to ensure the skills necessary to identify those at risk of suicide and provide the life-saving means to help.

The Helpline Center 211 staff continue to provide support to South Dakotans when it's needed most. Our staff responded to 64,350 calls, emails, and texts in 2023. With more than 5,300 programs and agencies in our database, 211 provides a quick and easy way to connect individuals to the resources they need, when they are needed most.

With our Volunteer Connections staff in Sioux Falls and Rapid City, we continue to work collaboratively with nonprofits who need volunteers and assist in connecting them with individuals and groups who want to help. We were honored to celebrate nearly 200 very deserving individual and group volunteers who were nominated for their extraordinary volunteer efforts.

None of this would be possible without dedicated staff, board members, and donors to the Helpline Center. Thank you for being a part of this exciting time for the Helpline Center!

## Helpline Financials

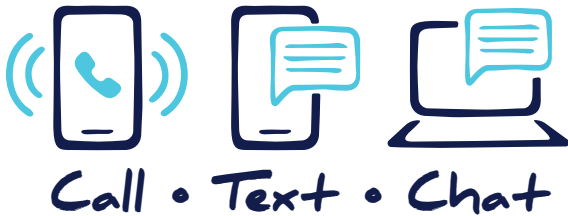
The Helpline Center incurred \$5,319,151 in expenses in 2023. Expenses include salaries, employee benefits and taxes, occupancy, professional fees, supplies, and miscellaneous expenses.

The Helpline Center received revenue in the amount of \$5,934,480 during 2023 to support its programs and services. The revenue resources included Contract Services/ Grants, United Ways, Contributions, Special Events, and Government Entities.

# 988 Lifeline

The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline launched on July 16, 2022 and since then, the incoming number of calls, texts, and chats continues to rise across South Dakota. In 2023, nearly 11,000 contacts to the 988 Mental Health Counselors were made. When South Dakotans call, text, or chat 988, they are connected to trained crisis counselors at the Helpline Center who listen to concerns, provide support, connect to additional resources, and provide follow up care. 988 is available 24/7 to provide help and hope for people having thoughts of suicide, a mental health or substance use crisis, or any other kind of emotional distress.

In South Dakota, 988 is a partnership between the Helpline Center and the South Dakota Department of Social Services – Division of Behavioral Health.



## A Few Highlights from 2023

- One caller was a victim of sex trafficking and called 988 for help. They were supported emotionally and guided to resources for housing, food, and other necessities. The person was extremely grateful to 988 for helping get their life back on track.
- Numerous parents have called 988 to simply thank the Helpline Center staff for helping their child in a time of need.
- A struggling caller reached out to 988 for help seeking addiction treatment. After doing so, the caller contacted 988 to thank them for their encouragement as that's what they needed to make a change.
- 988 counselors have connected with a wide range of people from across the age spectrum from 12 years to 80 years and have talked with people from every county in the state.



# 211 Helpline

No matter how simple or complex, the 211 Helpline staff is here for South Dakota, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. With more than 5,300 programs and agencies in our database, 211 makes it quick and easy to connect individuals to the resources they need when they are needed the most.

Each day, the compassionate and committed Helpline Center staff provide help and support to people from across the state. Sometimes, the support is a simple question like, "Where do I renew my driver's license?", or "Where can I volunteer?" Other times our calls are more complex, "I recently lost my job and I'm struggling to pay rent; is there anywhere I can get help?", or "My family needs groceries, where is the nearest food pantry?"

In 2023, the 211 Helpline staff responded to

**64,350 calls/emails/texts**

connecting people with important resources at critical times in their lives.



## How We Helped

At a recent expo, the Helpline Center hosted a booth that attracted many employees who were re-entering the workforce from prison. Some attendees were homeless or staying in hotels while seeking permanent housing. At the expo, the Helpline Center staff visited with an individual that was homeless and looking to secure housing. They discussed the felon-friendly housing list and later found out that he was able to secure an apartment due to utilizing this resource. Additionally, he learned about the resources available through 211 and contacted the call center. As a result, he was able to get furniture to furnish his new apartment and access rent deposit assistance.

An individual called 211 needing rides as she was in recovery from a drug and alcohol addiction and unable to drive due to drug charges. She had a limited support system in the area. Due to financial concerns, this caller had employment but needed transportation in order to maintain her job. Thanks to the Helpline Center transportation program, she was able to arrive at her court hearings and to work each day.

# Suicide Prevention & Aftercare

Nearly 50,000 people died in 2022 in the United States by suicide, leaving thousands of parents, siblings, wives, husbands, sons, daughters, and friends to survive the tragic loss.

In South Dakota, suicide is the 10th leading cause of death overall and the leading cause of death among 10- to 29-year-olds. In the nation, South Dakota has the 5th highest suicide death rate. The grief experienced by survivors of suicide loss is unique and these left behind often struggle with guilt, shame, and confusion. Losing a loved one to suicide can create a sense of isolation, which can often lead to depression and suicidal thoughts. The Helpline Center provides a point of connection for survivors, creating a safe space to share their pain through a support group or class, or through one of our events as a volunteer.

# Volunteer Connections

For more than four decades, the Helpline Center’s Volunteer Connections program has continued to be one of the largest and most active volunteer centers in the region. Over the last several years, our staff has worked tirelessly to connect an incredible number of volunteers with people across the state who needed help.

With staff in Sioux Falls and Rapid City, we work collaboratively with nonprofits who need volunteers and assist in connecting them with individuals and groups who want to help. The Helpline Center organizes an annual recognition event in Sioux Falls and Rapid City called the Spirit of Volunteerism awards. In 2023, 157 very deserving individual and group volunteers were recognized for their extraordinary volunteer efforts. Each honoree received a recognition package and we recognized all of the volunteers by providing each person or group a yard sign.

The Volunteer Connections program communicates throughout each year in a variety of ways. Each week an email is sent to 4,470 contacts in the Rapid City and Sioux Falls communities. There are 519 nonprofits registered in our volunteer database and over 1,508 volunteer opportunities available through the Volunteer Connections website, [volunteer.helplinecenter.org](http://volunteer.helplinecenter.org).

# The 437 Project



In September 2023, a group of 12 runners ran across the state of South Dakota raising awareness and funds for mental health and suicide prevention. With a mission to bolster both physical and mental wellness, the runners were made up of community leaders who stopped at nothing to influence and create positive change in our state for the second year.

On September 21, runners departed from the west side of the state to begin their 437-mile relay-style journey continuously for 4 days straight. Tackling the ever-changing South Dakota weather and terrain, the runners connected with communities as they raised funds and awareness for this initiative. They celebrated their accomplishments at the finish line in Sioux Falls on September 24.

An event of this size requires countless hours of preparation months in advance. From the runners building up their endurance, to the committee recruiting volunteers and sponsors while ironing out the numerous logistical details, The 437 Project is one of the largest fundraisers that benefits the Helpline Center.

In 2023, the event raised more than \$250,000. With a portion of those funds, the Helpline Center hosted Emma Benoit, a young suicide attempt survivor, as she shared her message with hundreds of attendees. Funds also allowed Helpline Center staff access to adequate training to ensure the skills necessary to identify those at risk of suicide and provide the life-saving means to help.
